CURRICULUM VITAE

Marco Klee Fallani was born in New York City on April 14, 1965. He attended the Istituto d'Arte di Porta Romana and the Accademia di Belle Arti in Florence. In 1990 he won a scholarship to study for a Masters of Fine Arts at California College of Arts, which he completed in 1993. He has participated in various shows both in sculpture and painting, and has won the painting prize from the city of Lucca. Fallani has worked as set designer for Luca Ronconi's production of *Lo Specchio*, he has collaborated in the making of the monument to Joe Louis for the city of Detroit and he prepared the moulds and the plaster casts of the Guiglielmo pulpit for the Museo dell'Opera del Duomo of Pisa. Private works include a commissioned portrait, a bronze sculpture for German government official and paintings commissioned for private individuals. His paintings and sculpture have been exhibited in Italy, the U.S. and the Netherlands. He designed the set for the Syracuse University – Teatro Del Maggio Musicale Fiorentino co-production of the operatic version of Maurice Sendak's book "Where the Wild Things Are". In 2005 he was commissioned by Syracuse University for *The Huntress*, a life-size sculpture in terra cotta. Fallani has been teaching painting and drawing for SU Florence since 1993.
